Don will describe a major project of the Boeing Employees Amateur Radio Society (BEARS) to renovate, upgrade and expand its facility at West Tiger mountain. The site was degraded by the challenging environment at 2,752 feet elevation, 12 miles SE of Seattle. The project is replacing radios, duplexers, antenna feedlines and most antennas. New capabilities are being added including internet access via microwave links, allowing networking via AllStarLink and Echolink. Work started in 2023 accelerated in early 2024 with the receipt of grant funding. Now partially complete, the project is expected to be finished in 2025.
